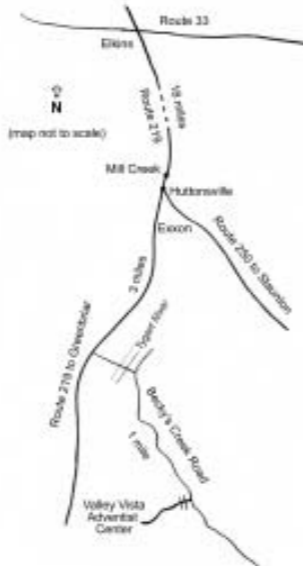


Mail Call

The camp phone line (304) 335-2000 is to be used for emergency purposes only. Two pay phones are available for personal calls.

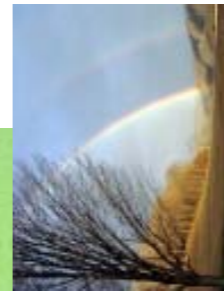
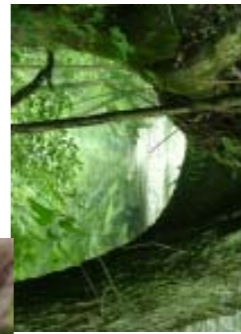


From Elkins, WV:
